Epiphany Water Blessing:

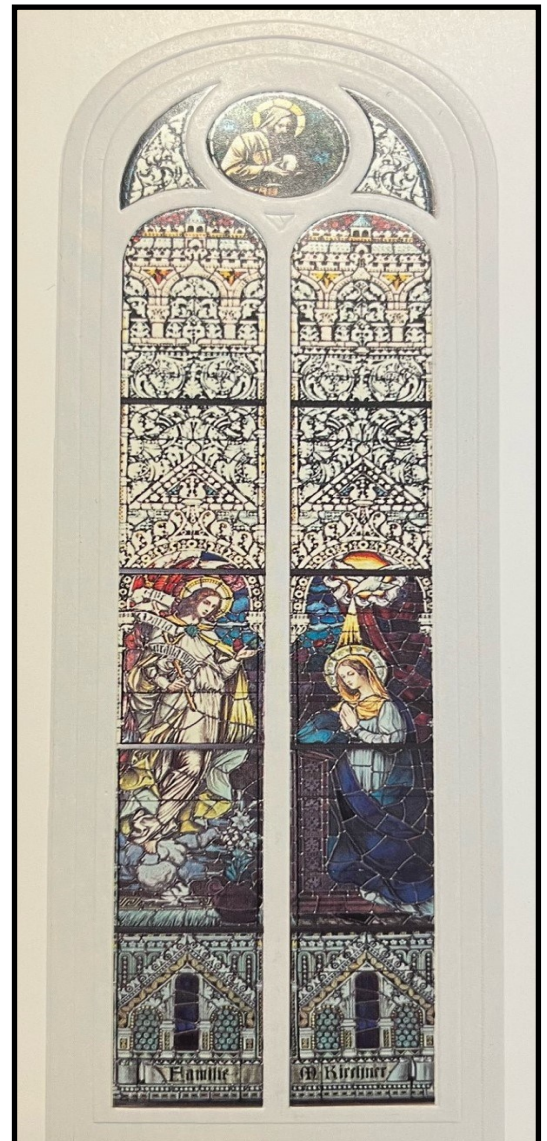
